AWAREity Reporting System



Reports can be submitted about **bullying/cyberbullying**, child nutrition, civil rights, curriculum and instruction (including potential violations of HB 1775), fraud/embezzlement, Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, legal concerns, professional standards/educator conduct, safety and security, school board complaints, data security and privacy, suicide/self-harm, sex discrimination or sexual harassment. The OLWEUS Bullying Prevention Program has a proven track record with over 40 years of research and has been recognized as the most extensively studied bullying prevention program of its kind.
